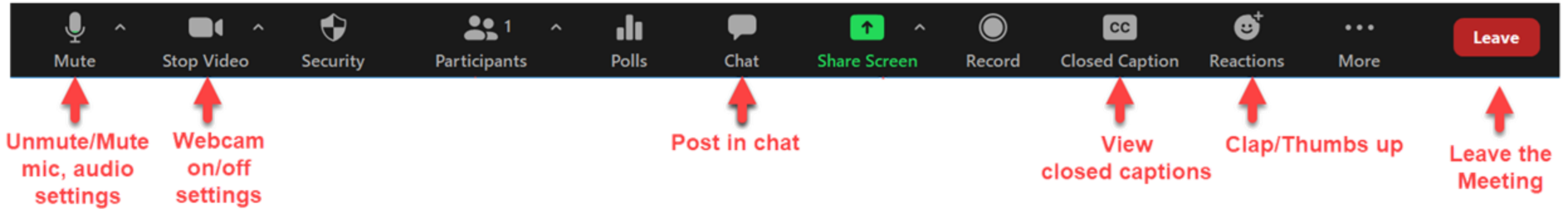

Shared Decision Making (SDM) and Practical Applications:

- 1) Define shared decision making (SDM) and describe the value of SDM in working with youth citing at least two studies;
- 2) Outline ethical principles and practices relevant to SDM as it relates to psychotherapeutic interventions, academic and employment pursuits, and psychiatric medication treatments;
- 3) Drawing from three distinct case examples, describe how SDM can be put into practice with younger individuals through transition-age youth;
- 4) Adapt SDM to diverse clinical situations conveying respect for the intersectional identities of the young person/family, modifying one's approach for particularly young people and in situations where there exist potential cultural gaps between young person and practitioner.

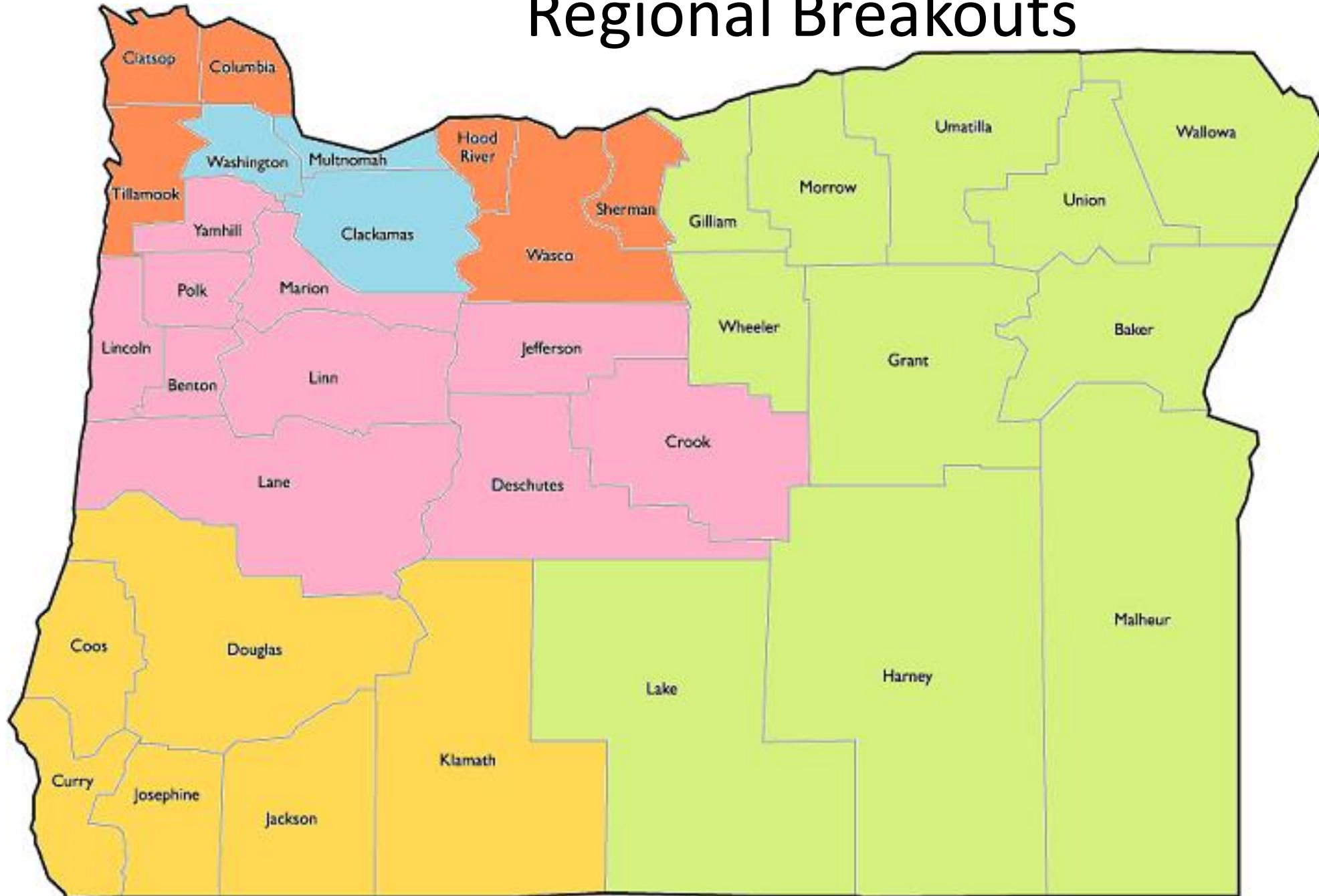
