Did the provider document vital signs including height, weight, blood pressure, and heart rate? May also reference nurse's or medical assistant's documentation.						/5
If antipsychotic medication is prescribed for the individual, is an Automatic Involuntary Movement Scale (AIMS) exam documented OR is there indication of when the next AIMS is due?						/5
If antipsychotic medication is prescribed for the individual, is there clear documentation of a full review of side-effects or is completion of a comprehensive side-effect scale such as the Glasgow Antipsychotic Side-effect Scale (GASS)?						/5
Did the provider appropriately document symptoms <i>and</i> the extent to which managing symptoms is or is not helping the participant reach their subjective goals/desired outcomes?						/5
Did the provider appropriately document risks (suicidality, harm to self or others)?						/5
Did the provider explain rationale for choices? Examples of this might include an explanation of why they might be using higher dose medication, prescribing a less metabolically favorable medication, why they are/are not utilizing a long-acting injectable, or why they are offering or addressing the participant's symptoms with clozapine.						/5
